

Rebuilding Ragged Island



As we all know, our beloved Ragged Island and its people, suffered tremendous loss and devastation from Hurricane Irma in September 2017. This current government administration's response to getting Ragged Island where it needs to be has been an absolute failure, and progress has remained at an unacceptably snail-slow pace.

Ragged Island deserves better! Infrastructure and communities need to not only be restored, but should be developed to create an economic engine that presents opportunities for the people of Ragged Island. I have consistently advocated on your behalf, and will continue to do so, as we work to bring about sustained economic development for Ragged Island. We have donated supplies to repair the Anglican Church which was used as a hurricane shelter as well as the Mission house. In addition, we have donated two freezer trailers to support the expansion of the fishing industry.









Outreach



Numerous town meetings were held throughout the island to keep residents abreast of ongoing developments for our 10-Point Plan toward eVision 2030. Special meetings were also held to discuss national issues, such as WTO, the decriminalization of marijuana, and responsible gaming.



Project -**Focus Group**

At times, issues will arise that require focus group intervention. Team Cooper has held many of these meetings including, but not limited to, the fair treatment of local tour operators, condition of facilities for fish fry vendors, and matters related to youth development.

Project -Collaboration

In order to obtain the results desired, working together is key. We continuously engage central and local government, through meetings, correspondence and in the House of Assembly. Once it is in the best interest of The Exumas and Ragged Island, we will continue to support these initiatives.









Outreach

Project-

Island Visits and Empowerment Tours

These tours are designed to reach the people of Exuma and Ragged Island where they are to provide community updates, receive questions and give answers, discuss concerns, and obtain input for the development of the master plan for our communities. The tours come in the form of a town hall, a focus group, or walk abouts. To date the settlements of Rolleville, Forbes Hill, Black Point, Staniel Cay and Ragged Island have participated, with additional visits and walk abouts planned.





Project-

Exuma Pride

The Exuma Pride Project (EPP) is designed to have a visible impact on the island in terms of cleanliness and pride; to make Exuma Island and Cays the model of excellence for The Bahamas; and to deliver a comprehensive, sustainable programme that greatly impacts the growth and development of Exuma Island and Cays. The plan was launched late 2018 and has received significant publicity and momentum. The poster essay competition at the schools was also a hit. To kick start the initiative. I donated my entire MP salary of \$28,000 towards the EPP. We thank Mr. Reg Smith and the countless number of volunteers that have joined the movement.



Project -

Louise Cooper Scholarship Fund



The Louise Cooper Memorial Scholarship Fund assists deserving students from low income families to receive tertiary education. The Fund was inspired by my personal upbringing and named in honor of my dear mother. Over the past four (4) years, the Fund has assisted nine (9) Exumians with a total of \$100,000 to attend The University of The Bahamas, Bahamas Technical Vocational Institute, and universities abroad.



Project -

Bahamas



Exuma is receiving significant growth mainly through foreign direct investments. In order to encourage harmonious, socio-economic balance Bahamas Empowerment Fund was formed as a venture capital vehicle to assist small and medium sized businesses. Over the past 24 months, I have personally invested more than \$75,000 for technical support to 25 entrepreneurs for business planning and to fund two (2) home-based businesses. Access to funding is a major impediment to locals seizing the opportunities that spin off from the island's economic growth.

Project -

Entrepreneurial Workshop



In working toward the Entrepreneurship and Empowerment component of the 10-Point Plan of eVision 2030, two Business Plan Training sessions were held in Exuma in 2017 and 2018. Another session is scheduled for the third quarter of 2019. These sessions are designed to ensure that residents are given every opportunity to be able to become the actual owners of businesses, and receive a greater share of the economic pie.

Fire Fighting Equipment



When we all focus on doing the best for Exuma, big things can happen. Four fire fighting water trailers arrived on Exuma, courtesy of Team Cooper, the Exuma Foundation and local government. The equipment was placed in strategic locations across Exuma for quick responses to fires and blazes. These were commissioned with trained volunteers under the command of Bradwin Hall, and makes for a safer, stronger, more empowered Exuma!

Summer Camp

In partnership with BAF Financial, Mrs. Cecillia Cooper has spearheaded summer camps in Exuma since 2014. The camps are designed to give kids the opportunity to engage in fun, meaningful exchange during the summer-break.

Back-to-School

It is my firm belief that education is indeed the key to success, and I make it a priority to engage with young people as they return to school. Team Cooper's Back-to-School give-away and school visits both provide an opportunity for this to happen. Each child is treated with a gift.

Easter

Easter is a special time of celebration and a time that kids enjoy Easter treats. Team Cooper's Easter Egg Hunt and basket distribution in the Cays, continue to be a welcomed treat for the young people in the community.

Christmas

After supporting Thanksgiving dinners, the year culminates with a Christmas party for the community. This is a time for residents, throughout the islands to come together for a party on the park as they make plans to celebrate the Holiday Season and set goals for the New Year. Each child is treated with a gift.

Junior Achievement

We launched the Aspire Junior Achievement Program with L.N. Coakley and St. Andrew's School to teach entrepreneurship and leadership at an early age.

We have spent more than \$75,000 on basketball programs, including the refurbishment of basketball courts and equipment in The Forest, Rolleville, Roker's Point and George Town. The Progressive Young Liberals (PYL) has conducted successful basketball tournaments in Ramsey, Exuma. This will continue in other communities.


Major Upcoming Projects

Project -

Exuma Youth Empowerment Center:

The first phase will include a 5,000 sq. ft. multipurpose center that will be a retreat for the youth of the island, including a 250 seat auditorium, library, class rooms, indoor-outdoor cafe, kitchen, game room and a green house for agriculture. There will also be a computer room equipped with the latest technology for training in audio-video and music production as well as graphic design. As the island is within the hurricane belt the building will be erected with back-up generator and mini clinic to also serve as a hurricane shelter. I have kick-started the project with a personal donation of \$10,000. Total investment projected to be \$600,000 for Phase I.





Project -

Forbes Hill Cultural Center:

Community Development

The Cultural Center will be a renovation of the historic Forbes Hill All Age School. Forbes Hill, The Ferry, Harry Cay and the surrounding communities will utilize the multi-purpose venue for a variety of reasons, including:

- · Weddings, meetings and other social events.
- · Youth empowerment center
- Hurricane Shelter and post-hurricane relief distribution
- The Housing of a small museum to showcase the history of the area
- · Craft center and small business booths

I have kick-started the project with a personal donation \$5,000.

Total investment by the Forbes Hill Association is projected to be \$150,000.

Jobs and Job Readiness

The goal is to get projects that create employment opportunities on track, identify skills throughout The Exumas and Ragged Island for the Job Skills Bank, and ensure that focused effort is made to train our people for the opportunities that new development will create. Job seekers and providers will meet in this online marketplace, along with skilled self-employed persons such as plumbers, electricians, etc.

Entrepreneurship and Empowerment

Team Cooper is focused on ownership and a greater piece of the economic pie for the islands. We will vigorously promote and support initiatives that strengthen Bahamian ownership, through entrepreneurship and empowerment workshops, including access to consultation on business ownership and business plan development.

Youth Development

We are on track to introduce youth development programs with the ground-breaking for the Exuma Youth Empowerment Center. This, along with the many programs aimed at ensuring the young people of The Exumas and Ragged Island have the resources to thrive, will develop a progressive environment for youth excellence.

Working toward eVision 2030

FOCUSED ON PEOPLE

Hospital, Healthcare and Wellness

Exuma is in desperate need of our new hospital that was opened by the previous government administration. This, along with the opportunity for Medical Tourism and other health and wellness initiatives, will create an environment that is fully prepared for the sustained economic development that we are fighting for.

We are encouraging the outsource of the management of the facility to speed up this development.

Infrastructural Update

We must not only fix existing infrastructure, but move to a more environmentally-friendly and cutting-edge methods for development. We will continue to push for completion of the Barrattere Dock, the new airport, roads, and relocation of the shipping port. With sun shining 365 days of the year, we must focus on solar energy. The Exumas and Ragged Island will lead the way. We will encourage and support businesses in this space.

Safety and Protection

The Exumas and Ragged Island are relatively safe, but there is always room for improvement. As we look to the future, we will continuously improve the fire fighting equipment in all communities, as well as launch the 'Crime Stoppers' initiative to ensure the safety of our people and those who visit us.





Scholarship and Education

The Louise Cooper Scholarship Fund will continue to expand as it identifies more needs that align with the development of The Exumas and Ragged Island. Education is always the key to success and the great equalizer, and we will ensure that resources are available for our young people to reach their potential.



Land Reform

Land reform is badly needed! In order to achieve what we have set out in eVision 2030, land reform is a critical matter being addressed, and ties into our push for empowerment. Your Member of Parliament will continue to advocate for land reform and access to crown land for Exumians and Ragged Islanders.



Community Development

So many programs and initiatives are a part of the fabric of community development. Team Cooper will continue to reach those in need, develop programs that empower our people to thrive, and through projects like Exuma Pride, build communities that provide inspiration for all Bahamians.





Sustainable Economic Development

With the rapid growth of the island of Exuma and the rebuilding of Ragged Island, a master plan will be created and adopted by the people of Exuma and Ragged Island through engagement and focus groups. The design will forecast the future growth of the island over the next 30 years and receive cross sector support from all stakeholders. The plan will engage appropriate consultants to crystallize and finalize previous work done by the Government and others, including Harvard University.
